Adopting the Recommended Constitution requires  $\underline{75\%}$  of members being present and voting (this is  $\underline{57}$  people). If you know you will be absent from this meeting you may vote by proxy. Proxy forms will be available at the October meeting and will be attached to the email with the documents to be considered.

## Club Speaker:

Sue Anderson was introduced by Liz Gielewski, and shared her very interesting "The Story of Me," bringing many memories to the fore for others present.

Sue joined Probus in 2005 and has been a very active member, taking on many official positions. Sue's father was a member of the metropolitan Fire Brigade and for many years the family lived in various Fire Stations, beginning at the historic Eastern Hill, and moving through Camberwell, Ivanhoe, Newport and Altona, to name a few.

Sue was born on 5<sup>th</sup> March 1946. She married Jeff in 1967, and they rejoiced in the births of three daughters: Megan, Sally and Melanie. Three grandchildren have now. become part of the family.

In 2000 Jeff retired and the family moved to Airey's Inlet. Unfortunately, Jeff did not keep good health and in 2011 needed to begin dialysis three times a week in Lorne. A team of volunteers from

Probus and the Men's Shed drove Jeff for these visits, which was greatly appreciated. Jeff passed away nine years ago.

#### **Guest Speaker:**

Michele Meehan was introduced by Liz Gielewski. Michele now lives in Airey's Inlet following a career in nursing and Parenting Matters. Her passion is summed up in the title of her talk, 'ReDress', and she inspired us with the need to repair, reuse and renew clothing and other material assets. Michele, herself, has not purchased any new clothes for six years and was able to demonstrate items that she has re-purposed, rather than consigning to landfill.

The statistics Michele shared were daunting.

The Fashion industry is the 3<sup>rd</sup> greatest source of world greenhouse emissions. Three fifths of all clothes purchased end up in landfill within 12 months. 35% of the microplastics in the oceans come from synthetic clothes washed in washing machines. 62% of all clothing is synthetic. Australians, on average, purchase 14.8kg of clothing each year.

What can we do?

Refuse to buy more clothes, rather reuse, repair, repurpose, rent, loan or swap, and seek other ways of enabling 'sweat shop workers' to earn a living.
